Curriculum


We have focused on the 5 R's (one a day) for our first week back whilst implementing our recovery curriculum. They are Routines, Relationships, Retrieve, Recap, and Review. Children have heard about Bubble time. memory jars and happiness boxes to name but a few. We used stories as our hook into learning.

We have introduced some positive changes. For example, we now offer outdoor learning provision as part of our curriculum offer which we call 'welly days'. Children will engage in forest school type learning experiences and enjoy what the great outdoors has to offer with Mrs Cairns. We look forward to building dens, making sculptures and enjoying hot chocolate around the campfire circle.

We have renamed our school house teams after pioneering women to Blue/Florence Nightingale. Purple/Harriet Tubman, Red/Frida Kahlo and Green/Emmeline Pankhurst. Children are learning about them currently and because we promote a love of books and stories, all our classes have a wow reading area for children to enjoy, pictures will be put on our website

We can't do some things like we used to, so for enrichment clubs the children now stay in their class bubble and they receive a different enrichment club each week. On Thursday, I started this off with the theme

The enrichment all happened via zoom. It was a really wonderful experience as the children could see all the other classes as well as myself and see both schools in the Federation. They sat so beautifully, listened and joined in and the drawings were fantastic. Each Thursday morning first thing, a different member of staff will deliver the enrichment experience.

Covid-19

You'll have heard about the new law of 6 persons in a group from Monday but this doesn't apply to schools. However, please may I politely remind you that in the school setting we still have social distancing measures to adhere to and promote and although, outside of school you have your own private arrangements, we do need you to distance as much as possible from one another whilst on our school site to keep us all safe. We have noticed at pick up times many linger and socialise closely together and this then sends a different message to the children when we are trying to teach them about distancing and keeping safe.

We have not introduced staggered pickups and drops off times for different classes as this would create problems for our families with siblings. Hopefully, you'll recognise that should parents not promote distancing we may have to introduce staggered start and end times for each class which we want to avoid. Thank you for helping us with this safety measure by distancing and leaving the site as soon as you collect your child/children.

We would also respectfully ask parents/carers to wear a face covering when dropping off and collecting their child/children on the school sites and if you do need to urgently come into the school offices, please also wear a face covering.

This is the season when children will start to catch colds and coughs now we are all back in school full time. If your child just has a mild cold they may continue to attend school. This includes having a mild cough related to a cold. We are all aware of the clear COVID-19 related symptoms and you will know how your child displays symptoms when they have a cold.
